

# SUMMER "PREPARATION" FOR ABOVE GRADE LEVEL AND GT MATH STUDENTS

Dear Parents and Guardians of Rising 4th, 5th, and 6th Grade Math Students,

As each school year comes to a close, parents and teachers look for materials to keep their students well-practiced and prepared for the next school year. This is very much the case for students in Above Grade Level and GT Math.

A third grader, who has recently tested into GT math (for example), must be prepared to work on accelerated 4th, 5th, and 6th grade skills come the fall. A fourth grader, continuing with GT math, must be proficient in 6th grade skills, and show readiness to learn 7th grade content as a 5th grader. 5th graders, heading into middle school, must prepare for a variety of content from 6th grade math through Pre-algebra.

Please **do not** feel that you must teach your child **everything** about the upcoming curriculum. These activities are OPTIONAL. **Pre-teaching** is different from **preparation and awareness**. Find areas where your child needs support and work on those standards. Trying to front-load and master major chunks of upcoming curriculum is **not productive nor advised.**
